



Selected 2011 Census data on cultural and linguistic diversity in WA

Kellerberrin Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the Kellerberrin LGA has a total population of **1,181** people:

- 10.2% were born overseas
- approximately 3.0% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 2.9% speak a language other than English at home.

 (Total – Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
